- Takashi Homma (born in Tokyo, 1962) lives and works in Tokyo. He studied photography at Nihon University College of Art but left in 1984 to take a job as an in-house photographer at a Tokyo advertising agency.
- In 1991, he moved to London to work as a photographer for i-D magazine. In 1999, he was awarded a Kimura Ihei Commemorative Photography Award for the project Tokyo Suburbia (1998). A major retrospective of his work opened at the 21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, Kanazawa, in 2010.
- Contributing author Tim Benton is Professor Emeritus of Art History at the Open University. He has written several books on Le Corbusier.
